


# Rocket City Site of National 'Mended Hearts' Conference

# **Community Free Dental** Clinic All About Smiles

The Community Free Dental Clinic (CFDC) aims to provide quality free dental care and education to low-income, uninsured adult residents of Madison County. One of the greatest needs in Madison County is dental care for adults 19 and over.

The CFDC was established in March 2013 to serve the working poor, elderly, veterans, and the homeless in Madison County. The United Way did a survey of the county last year and the standout need was dental care. CFDC is a nonprofit that depends on donations from the community.

Alabama is the sixth poorest state in America. The poverty level in Madison County is 13.9% of the population or about 45,000 people. This population is largely undereducated, working paycheck to paycheck with no money left for dental care.

The elderly live on fixed incomes and are in need of dentures but cannot afford to have their teeth pulled, and some homeless veterans are faced with the same dilemma. All have broken, painful teeth and they can get infected gums or abscesses which are life-threatening. The bacteria can go to the heart and brain and in some cases precipitate a heart attack or stroke. The volunteer dentists can pull the teeth to relieve the pain and give antibiotics for infections all free to the patients. Since 2013, when the clinic opened, over 5,000 people have been helped as of March 2016. CFDC is changing lives and transforming the health of those unable to afford urgent dental care.

The Community Free Dental Clinic--(DBA) "The Free Dental Clinic"--is a 501(c)3 non-profit. Funding comes from organizations, individuals, local businesses, grants, and churches. In addition to monetary donations we receive office supplies, tooth brushes, tooth paste and dental supplies.

The clinic is operated by licensed, volunteer dentists from the local community, licensed nurses who evaluate and help educate the patients in their care, chair side assistants who assist the dentists and the office staff who register the patients and make

# **Planning Session Aims to Attract PWR**

Many people and organizations are asking the question, "What can Huntsville do to foster peace here and in the world?" There is an exciting new initiative to bring the Parliament of World's Religions to Huntsville.

The next meeting will be held Tuesday, November 15, 3-5 p.m. at the United Way Building, 701 Andrew Jackson Way, Huntsville.

The Parliament is the oldest, largest, and most inclusive interfaith gathering in the world. It attracts 10,000 attendees from 80 countries and 50 faith traditions for several days of plenaries, workshops, dialogues, sacred music, films and more. Since the first Parliament in 1893, this historic event has taken place in Chicago, Cape Town, Barcelona, Melbourne, and Salt Lake City.

Next steps include the support of additional local organizations, faith groups and individuals. This support is needed in the form of:

- 1) Letter or e-mail to IMS stating support of the idea of bringing the Parliament gathering to the city of Huntsville.
- 2) Donations to the second level application fee (\$2,500) are welcome and needed but not required.
- 3) Checks made to IMS with notation "Parliament of World's Religions " or "PWR".
- 4) Interested volunteers for planning and develop-

The project has strong initial momentum. Unity Church on the Mountain has stepped forward as the

first congregation to write a letter to IMS in support; they have identified a volunteer representative; and they have donated financially.

A core team of volunteers has established a working relationship with the Huntsville Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) and the Von Braun Center. both of which are ready and eager to support the

Parliament.

They have raised the \$2,500 needed to submit a first draft hosting proposal. And they have been in communication with PWR leadership, which has offered encouragement and support.






# **Champion Game Plan for Life**


